It facilitates partnerships, often new and unconventional, between government and the private sector to develop, test, and launch new initiatives. These collaborations speed the execution of demonstration projects, effect expansion of successful pilot programs, and support rapid implementation to meet the public health needs of individuals, families, and communities across New York City.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The New York City Creating Breastfeeding Friendly Communities (CBFC) in collaboration with DOHMH Neighborhood Health Action Centers seeks to develop a breastfeeding supportive neighborhood by activating faith-based leaders, childcare centers, worksites, policy makers and others to ensure that breastfeeding becomes the norm for all families.

Launched September 2016, Neighborhood Health Action Centers offer space for the Health Department, high-quality health care providers, community-based organizations and other non-profits to co-exist and engage in the planning, coordination and advocacy that are critical to address the often complex and multiple needs of communities burdened with higher rates of chronic diseases. Action Center locations include Brownsville, East Harlem and Tremont.

POSITION OVERVIEW

The part-time CBFC Intern (up to 18 hours per week) will support the development of Breastfeeding Friendly Day Care Centers and Family Day Care Homes and worksites in Brownsville, East Harlem and Tremont in accordance with New York State Department of Health Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) guidelines.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Outreach and develop new Childcare/ Day Care Home/Worksites partnerships
 - Work with child care centers /day care homes and worksites to complete all steps for NY State Breastfeeding-Friendly Designation.
- Update existing Day Care Center, Family Day Care Home and Childcare Coalition partner contacts
- Provide technical assistance childcare providers seeking *Breastfeeding Friendly* designation utilizing NYS CACFP tools.
- Gather and track all documentation for Baby Café sessions
- Support baby café sessions as needed
- Tailor training materials and opportunities to the unique needs of Family Day Care Home providers

- Assist in the planning and promotion of local breastfeeding events

QUALIFICATIONS

- Graduate student in public health or a related field preferred
- Certified Lactation Counselor with a minimum of 2 years of experience.
- Strong communication skills (written and verbal) required.
- Experience with community outreach and/or engagement.
- Ability to be work independently and be flexible.
- Ability to commit 15 to 20 hours per week.
